- *Grants* this year have been given to the Village Hall & Playing Field Committee's and to the church for the Christmas Lights

PARK FARM— Information

I write to introduce myself as the operations manager for A Hughes and Son (Skellingthorpe) Ltd. As you are aware GH By products (Derby) Ltd have been granted permission for the change of use of the existing tank at Park Farm for the storage of waste of an agricultural benefit to land. The waste is delivered to the farm and pumped into the tank where it is stored, ready for spreading on a suitable day. Spreading is being conducted by our own staff and we are not using contractors to undertake this task as has happened in the past, which gives us complete control.

The spreading is via injection equipment and controlled by state of the art GPS field tracking systems. This ensure the waste is injected in accordance with our Environmental Management System and permit which is regulated by the Environment Agency. The equipment is state of the art expensive and one of the best available systems. I have attached some pictures for your reference the computer screen highlights the level of control. We plan to inject during the week whenever possible and not complete this task over weekends however it depends on weather and the tanks capacity.

We have received a number of visit from the Environment Agency who have given advice and guidance on control measures and to ensure we are operating in accordance with our permit. The Environment agency have been particularly helpful in the conducting of documentation improvements and management controls. Rest assured we are doing all that is possible to control any off site odour and will be looking to introduce further improvements in the coming weeks via a further planning application.

Hello all,

Parking continues to be a problem force wide, in Willingham By Stow it has always been difficult down the High Street with vehicles parking on both sides, don't block the pavements, please be considerate, could an emergency vehicle get through? If not park where it is not causing any obstruction, WALK leave your vehicle further away its better for you!

Parking – do not park facing the traffic flow. why would you do this? It makes your insurance void if someone hits your car after dark.
